higher education among Women The idea of establishing an educational institute to educate women of central India was conceived by Honble Shri Parmanand Bhai Patel a renowned industrialist and a great philosopher of Jabalpur On April 27 1956 the foundation stone was laid down on 11 acres of government land situated in the heart of Jabalpur city by the then Chief Minister of MP Looking at the progress of the Home Science and Arts Faculty Government of Madhya Pradesh in 1958 granted permission to conduct science classes under science faculty as well The college is affiliated to Rani Durgavati Vishwavidyalaya Jabalpur which awards degrees to the students Government M H College is one of the pioneering institutions of Madhya Pradesh that adopted the autonomous system in higher education in 1989 NAAC accredited the college with B plus grade in 2003 and subsequently with A grade with CGPA 3 point 41 in the 2nd cycle in 2012 and B plus grade with CGPA 2 point 61 in the 3rd
